

At the April 12th meeting of the Cornish Planning Board Mr. Wallace informed the members that he had recently been to inspect the rubbish incinerator project at North Conway N.H. This prompted discussion of our problem: the open burning dump in Cornish which by state regulation will be closed in 1973. Alternates were discussed and it was decided to discuss the problem again at a later meeting. Robert Pike brought up the issue of appointment of members to the planning board. He suggested and the board agreed that April meeting after town meeting would be the ideal time. Members will be appointed at the rate of one per year for a five year term. Mr. Pike also okayed the use of the number of the town phone for calls relating to planning board business.

Concerning subdivision standards it was suggested that abbreviated copies concerning regulations for subdivision be sent to every tax payer in the town.

It was learned that Mr. Sam Simmonds has recently subdivided a piece of land originally consisting of 169 acres in South Cornish without consulting the board. No decision was made as to what action would be taken.
