MINUTES SELECTMEN'S MEETING January 13, 1986

Present: Donald Jack, Jim Seelye and Dr. Dibiaso

- 1) The company presenting the Cable TV service attended and explained what was planned. The Contract was signed, and installation expected to start within 18 months.
- 2) Dana Monton, Frank Cannoll and two Cannoll boys presented Frankie's proposal of crushing rock on the Limerick Cornish line to the Selectmen. All abuttons will be notified. Also need permission to repair the end of road that has been abandoned by the Town. (Need letter from the Town stating that it is o.k. to improve that section of road to Stone Neighborhood. Expect no complaints from abutting landowners).
- 3) Bill to Church - Dec. 15 - Jan. \$375 plus \$20 for Gordon as Janitor. (R. S. Brewer, Pastor, Foothills Baptist Church, P. O. Box 206, Cornish, ME 04020.)
- 4) Sacopee High School would like to use Town Hall for a play on 2-15-86. Same date as Kiwanis Dance. To rehearse here and should have a key. The cirtaom needs to be mended. Cannoll Perkins can repair it on the Bag Lady. Sacopee will call Dr. as he is in charge of Town Hall.
- 5) Kiwanis Valentine Dance, February 15, 1986
- 6) Surplus Food, February 14, 1986 9:30 - noon.
- 7) Lock on switchbox broken. Gordon will have Lloyd Sargent repair it.
- 8) Have Thurman Mills fill in holes where projector was while he is painting. Mrs. Dibiaso was going to have a linoleum laid, this should be done before February.
- 9) Budget Committee meeting should be held January 27th. Application for liquor license also January 27th. Budget Committee will meet at the Cornish School at 7:30 p.m. All members on last year appointed: M. Oulette, Chairman; H. Shepherdson; W. Taylor; C. Birchfield; P. Pease; A. Lane; J. Stewart; J. Traunig. Alternates: P. Small; F. Ray; J. Kelley.
- 10) Mrs. Weymouth's letter: a copy to Charlene and one in our file.
- 11) R. Benson: Sent a letter for \$20 and requested that we pay it. He had the work done without our approval.
- 12) Article in Warrant re cars on Sidewalks. Also an Artic le re Town Office in Town Hall with set hours.
- 13) Bill for Water District went before legislature. Henry Black presented it. Copy to PUC. Howard should list all equipment included in sale and the lots. He should draw up a Purchase and Sale Agreement. PUC won't

touch it until past by legislature. Need 5 members to form a Board of Directors.

14) Some citizens of Cornish have contacted a Lawyer stating that Jim Seelye was in contempt by not having the Building Permits and plan to sue the Town. Then Don addressed Jim "Do you have your Building Permits from W. Smith?"

Jim: Permit to put in 1 sink and bathroom and Permit for septic system.

Don: Wasn't this building permit revoked because you couldn't prove you owned the building?

Jim: The Deed was in Alfred.

Doc asked how should we handle this?

Jim: Asked who signed the complaint. Smith approved septic after it was done.

Don: Do you have a building permit as such.

Jim: At Home. I don't have a plumbing permit as David Whitney took it with him.

Doc: What permits have been issued that we have copies of.

Don: Walt gave you permits for construction of your building?


Jim: Yah. I have had permits for everything I have done.
