

Selectmen's Meeting October 11, 2006

Vinal Pendexter, John Palmer, and Peggi Aspinall were present for the meeting.

Selectmen read and discussed the new PSAP contract for the Town dispatching fire and rescue through the Maine State Police in Gray. The contract was signed by the selectmen.

Accounts payable and payroll warrants reviewed and approved along with the minutes from the last meeting.

A letter from Mr. J. Piccinni asking questions on the revaluation codes was read. He has four questions he'd like addressed: 1. How was the value of the various tax code districts decided? 2. Is there a percentage that can be easily computed by tax payer in order to find different valuations between the tax codes 40, 50, 60, 65, and 70? 3. How is the percentage of depreciation determined on a house? 4. Would property on a town road not maintained by the town be of more or less value than on a town maintained road? Vinal will write a letter addressing the concerns of Mr. Piccinni.

Additionally, Mr. Piccinni requested that the Town provide year round maintenance of the Pease Hill road beyond Kevin Mason's up to his property at 303 Pease Hill road. A motion was made to send a letter to Mr. Piccinni informing him that he needs to submit an article for the Town Warrant formally requesting this action to take place. Seconded and approved.

Our copy of a letter from David Brandt to Dennis Mowry in regards to the annual audit stating that there is no pending or threatened litigation that he knows of at this time. Letter to be filed with the annual audit.

An investigative request for law enforcement data from US Government Office of Personnel Management looking for data we may have on a Ryan Keith Tibbits. He actually lives at 123 Mudgett Road in Parsonsfield and secondly, Anna Alba Merin Voland who lives at 32 Cumberland Street. The Selectmen determined that we do not have any criminal record for either person and stated as much on the forms before signing them.

A Letter from US Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division written to David Brandt on September 26 informing that they have closed their investigation of the Town of Cornish for alleged violations of the American's with Disabilities Act of 1990.

Peggi Aspinall read a response from MMA to the issue of an ordinance providing restrictions regarding a sex offender moving into town.

Norm MacIntyre substantiated his efforts to collect the \$420 from Leon Chadwick to pay Alpha One for their services without success. Selectmen reluctantly agreed to pay the invoice.


A request from Gary Mason to store Historical Society artifacts in the back room of the old fire barn was discussed. A motion was made to approve the request. Seconded and approved.
