- IV. Abatement of Gary Wadsworth's taxes because of the fact there was only  $\frac{1}{2}$  completed as of April 1, 1978 Taxes decreased to \$266.98.
- V. Appointed Marcia Pendexter as Bookkeeper and Sec't. (3-0)
- VI. Petition from Mason's Verity for Sunday sales of Liquor.
- VII. Appointed Walter Smith as plumbing inspector
