

Selectmen's Meeting October 31, 2003

The minutes from the last meeting were signed. The accounts payable and the payroll warrant were signed,

Sylvia Pease came in to update her information on this winters snowplowing. She also discussed the new Fire station's placement and the complaints that she had heard. The verbiage for the land swap was reviewed. It is stated that the land would be deeded to the Town, not the fire dept. She also discussed the after school program. It seems to be working out well.

Henry Holmes and Chad Humphrey came into discuss the Peters Rd. They wanted to know if it is a town road and if it could be extended to the house that Mr. Holmes is building. Vinal told them that it is up to the person requesting the extension to prove the roads status. Mr. Holmes has his lawyer working on this and he will back for the next meeting.

A property tax abatement form was received James Robinson. Vinal asked for a motion to send him a letter doesn't do poverty abatements. Peggi made this motion and John seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous. A letter will be sent to him stating this decision.

Vinal said that he had been approached about swapping the Accessories Unlimited building, plus considerations, for the old (currant) fire station. Peggi made a motion to find out what other considerations they are proposing. John seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

A letter was received from Avesta. They are requesting that the road be taken over by the town. They stated that they have brought thee road up to town specifications. The letter was filed in the appropriation file, so it can be put on the warrant for Town meeting.


There was a discussion about the letters Rob Millard needs to send out to the people that are living in Cornish without occupancy permits. Mr. Chan needs to be added to the list.





Vinal also explained about the Vision software. It is put in the computer so that real estate people can access this information online that way they don't have to come into the town office.
