

Selectmen's Meeting November 8, 2006

Vinal Pendexter, John Palmer, and Peggi Aspinall were present for the meeting.

Lori Carr presented various size options along with price estimates for replacement "Welcome to Cornish" signs for the town. Selectmen will decide on style and quantity once they review the options Lori provided.

Josh Mack from Southern Maine Regional Planning here representing the Route 113 Corridor Committee on the subject of the Scenic Byway Application that is a Federal and State grant (80-20) program. Mr. Mack left informational packets with the selectmen for their review in order to determine if Cornish would be interested in joining the Scenic Byway project. If the Town is interested in joining the project, Mr. Mack asked that a letter of support be written expressing intent by January.

The selectmen received Clyde Smith Scholarship Fund applications and requested the applications be taken to Mr. Donovan Guidance Councilor at the high school.

Accounts payable and payroll warrants reviewed and approved along with the minutes from the last meeting.

Motion made to enter into Executive Session to discuss background check. Motion to resume regular meeting. Seconded and approved.

Selectmen were made aware of an application for liquor license for the Sawmill restaurant in the new development called Village Station. A motion was made to hold a Public Hearing at the beginning of the next selectmen's meeting to be held November 22nd. Seconded and approved.

A request was approved for John Barton to use the Fire Barn on Tuesday, November 14th from 8-10 am for special education department Professional training.

Approval was granted to pay an invoice from Bergen & Parkinson, LLC for their work to date regarding Roland Scott's illegal junkyard.

The selectmen discussed setting a time to process the abatement requests received to date. Diane gave the selectmen a copy of the MMA abatement and appeals guidelines for their review. It was decided to meet and process the abatement applications received to date on Sunday, November 12th. Vinal asked Diane to contact Vision to remind them to forward the data on how they came up with the land values for Saco Woods he asked for.

An invoice was submitted by C.A.B. for the Town's financial commitment to the seasonal restroom project. A difference in interpretation of the commitment made with C.A.B. was discussed. A motion was made to require C.A.B. to provide invoices for work completed to be reviewed by selectmen before payment is made.

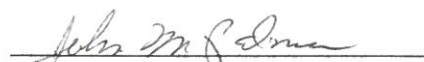
