

SELECTMEN'S MEETING NOVEMBER 26, 2003

Scott Pingree and John Bleakney came in to discuss the purchase of a truck that can be turned in to a fire truck. It is located in Florida and was listed on a military surplus magazine. They have enough money saved in the update equipment fund to cover the truck and the outfitting of it. John made a motion to support the fire dept. in their purchase. Peggi seconded the motion, the vote was unanimous.

The minutes from the last meeting were signed. The accounts payable and the payroll warrants were signed.

There was a discussion about the plowing of the sidewalks. Peggi made a motion to meet with CAB for ideas and to find out which sidewalks. John seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

A letter was received from Bernard Mason requesting abatement for the Grange Hall lot that he purchased. John made a motion that Diane will write a letter to Mr. Mason stating that the property will be reassessed before the next tax period.

It was decided that there would be no selectmen's meeting on Dec. 24th. The selectmen can come in and sign the warrants and minutes when they get a chance. A business card size ad will be posted in the shopping guide canceling the meeting.

A letter was received from Marcus, Clegg, & Mistretta inviting the Selectmen to a meeting in Kennebunk for the Merc. Litigation. Peggi and Vinal are planning to attend. A meeting will be set up with the trash committee to discuss the new curbside trash pick-up contract.

It was decided that the budget committee will meet on the 12th of January. An add will be put in the Shopping Guide looking for people to be on the committee.


David Whitney had asked if he could get his first snowplow check a little early. Peggi made a motion that his check gets cut on the 8th of Dec. Vinal seconded the motion.

It was decided that if any group wants to rent the hall in the winter they would be asked to pay an extra \$100.00 for heat.
