

**Selectmen's Meeting  
December 10, 2003**


Margo Frasier came in to close out the budget for the Thompson Park grant. She brought in a budget summary, and it was signed. She also came in to talk about the Heli Modified grant. The contract goal was not fulfilled, as they didn't employ as many people as they were supposed to. The town can sell the building to cover the cost of the building or continue to lease it out, but the grant will have to be paid back. The selectmen will have to talk to the Eddy's since they have expressed an interest in buying the building.

Cindy and Mike Austin came in to talk about the taxes on their new house. They sold a log home on 5 acres and are building a new home on 3 acres. Mike said that the new house was only partially framed as of April 1<sup>st</sup>. He also wanted to know why 3 acres are appraised the more than the 5 acres that he owned previously. Vinal told them that this problem will be looked at and they will get back to them.

Steve Smith, Bob Lary, Greg Wilfert, and David Whitney came in to discuss the snowplowing around the park. Vinal had Bobby Sturgeon go down with his loader and clean out what he could, and Steve and Bob hand shoveled the rest of it. Vinal has talked to F.R. Carroll about the sidewalk in Limerick and has found out that the equipment needed is cost prohibitive. The fence can't be removed for the winter, as it wouldn't stand up to the handling. David explained that during a big storm he really doesn't have the time to send a smaller truck to take care of the fence. He will try not to push any more snow on the fence that he can, but there isn't a lot of room. The fence will have to be cleared by hand then the snow can be picked up and removed after the storm. Next year CAB and the selectmen will meet to see if they can come up with a better solution. Vinal will meet with CAB Saturday morning at the park to check things out. David also has some other problems with turnarounds. Vinal told him to come in with specifics and letters can be sent out to try to correct the problem.

The minutes from the last meeting were signed. The accounts payable and the payroll warrant were signed. Carol gave each of the selectmen a copy of current account status. Diane had a report showing commitment, supplements, and abatements that were processed so far this year.

A letter was received from Stephen Dibiaso and Chris Birchfield concerning their interest in letting the town take over the Accessories building and their taking over the current fire station building after it is vacated. They claim their building is worth \$560,000.00 and that the fire station is worth \$65,000.00. They also stated that they would hold the note for a 15-year term. This letter will be filed.
