1) Hearing - Liquor license Egan Enterprises, d/b/a Stoneridge Resturant. No opposition. Question: he has stated on application that he is owner, no problem, pending sale of business. 2) Transfer Station; Mr. Richmond Stevens of Well and Tom Staples presented a proposal. They service Waterboro, Ogunquit, Lyman, Shapleigh. Have been in operation since 1980. 27 years of rubbish pick-up, both commercial and residential. Any funds to go ahead with this Transfer Station will be appropriated at Town Meeting. No permits obtained for So. Hiram site. See attached proposal. --

7) MOTION MADE AND SECONDED THAT SEAVEY PRINTERS BE APPOINTED TO DO THE TOWN REPORTS. VOTE.

8) Town Reports: Bulk Mail \$50 and \$50 permit fee plus 12½¢ per report. MOTION MADE AND SECONDED THAT WE APPLY FOR AND PURCHASE BULK MAILING PERMIT. VOTE.

9) Sanding. Bonnie voiced dissatisfaction with the Sanding, and would like to take it away from Sanborn. He is using a huge amount of salt and sand. Impossible to get a replacement at this time of the year. Can not legally stop him this year. Ronnie is to talk with F. Sanborn about the sanding, time, etc.

To the towns of Cornish and Parsonfield:

Preliminary criteria and available cost estimates for setting up solid waste transfer station.

Obtaining site for transfer station;

The site should be at least two acres in area, well drained and locate, if possible, to have optimum convenient access for both towns. The site should have a portion that has at least a 10% slope for efficient placing of cement work and equipment with minimum disturbance of area and minimum cost of site preparation. Three phase power at the site would be desirable.

As you probably are aware this type of installation requires full permitting by the D.E.P. The D.E.P. requires soil tests of the site and detailed plans from a licensed engineering firm. Cost estimates for engineering and D.E.P. permits must be obtained directly from the engineering firm which you choose for the job.

Our company has the experience to build the station including all site work if the town desires. This would include financing over a predetermined period. We will also install all required equipment to make the installation functional with adequate financing if desired. We are available for consultation or to answer any questions that you may have.
