

Selectmen's Meeting February 25, 2009

Vinal Pendexter, Peggi Aspinall, and Nancy Perkins were present for the meeting.

ecomaine representative Missi Labbie presented the 2008 single stream recycling statistics for Cornish. The town realized a 45% increase in recycling. Missi offered to put up a booth at the Apple Festival to answer questions and promote recycling.

Warrants and minutes were signed.

Jessica Bussiere request to hold SVHS Class of '99 reunion at Pike Hall was discussed. Issues with the request: a. restrooms cannot handle a large group, b. concern about condition of the building, c. ADA issues with it not being a non-profit. Motion made to deny request due to ADA issues. Seconded and approved.

Ken Hall submitted a wish list of projects for the selectmen to consider that may qualify for Federal Government Stimulus Plan funds.

Debbie Baker requested use of the fire barn on March 10th from 2 – 8 p.m. for Girl Scout cookie distribution. Motion made to have Scott Pingree review the letter and if he agrees, approve the request. Seconded and approved.

MMA provided a quote of \$2,113.00 for a Workers Compensation policy. Selectmen decided for the \$200 in savings they would stay with Lovejoy Agency.

The code enforcement officer scheduled hours at the town hall were discussed. The selectmen tabled the discussion and will revisit it at the next meeting.

L. Hentchel's real estate abatement request was reviewed. Motion made to deny the abatement for the fact the land is assessed consistently with all other land in the town of Cornish. Seconded and approved.

Diane reported that the annual report is back from the printer and selectmen were asked to review it.

Peggi revisited the issue of David Whitney not keeping the gates locked to the salt pile. Nancy offered to call David and ask him to keep it locked.
