

Selectmen's Meeting
March 15, 2006

Vinal Pendexter, John Palmer and Peggi Aspinall were present.

A report from Maine State Planning Office regarding municipal recycling efforts was reviewed and discussed.

The selectmen reviewed a letter of complaint received in response to their decision not to approve use of the fire barn for an April 1st Bridal shower request she submitted. The selectmen discussed it with no action to be taken.

Berry Tibbitts, Kennebunk Town Manager has arranged for "Workcamp 2006: a labor of love" to participate in York County this summer. Mr. Tibbitts wrote to request the selectmen's assistance in identifying work sites for the elderly residents that would benefit from the group's efforts. Diane and Elaine will compile a list of candidates to submit.

Response from Maine Municipal regarding the request for clarification of the Sacopee Recreation Council's article for the Town Warrant was reviewed and discussed by the selectmen.

The selectmen presented the Boston Post Cane to Mrs. Ethel Osgood earlier in the day. They requested copies of the photos be distributed to ^{Diane} Ed Harry and Kathy Carr for write up in our local papers. It was suggested that a photograph of the current holder of the cane be displayed with the cane. All agreed.

Old business:

Vinal updated the selectmen on the changes at DOT and indicated that the contact he used was no longer available. The issues related to Thompson Park traffic flow and the intersections with poor visibility remain to be addressed.

Elaine will call the owner of Grey Barn Nurseries for the selectmen in response to a letter received by Mr. Klosowski about the commercial property valuations being done. He has an owner occupied premises and the valuation data requested does not apply.

Peggi initiated conversation regarding the large section of flooding that created a large ice patch on Maple Street due to a resident pumping the water out of their basement. She was informed that DOT had been contacted due to an earlier complaint on the same issue.

Selectmen reviewed the calculations for the diesel costs incurred by Mellen & Son Disposal. The motion was made to request that Mr. Mellen come to the next meeting (March 29th) to discuss the findings and make a determination. Seconded and approved.

New business:

Southern Maine Regional Planning sent a request for nominees from the town to sit on their Executive Committee that will meet April 1st. No nominations due to work schedule conflicts.

Selectmen reviewed and approved the accounts payable and payroll warrants along with the minutes from our meeting on 3/1.

Vinal suggested we look into purchasing new tables to replace the tables currently in use at the town hall which have deteriorated due to lending them out. New tables would not be available for use outside the town offices.
