

MINUTES CORNISH SELECTMEN'S MEETING - March 28, 1988

Present: W. Neal; R. Othuse; T. Carper

- 1) Elect Chairman of Board of Selectmen. Warren Neal nominated. Seconded. VOTE
- 2) Computer people coming March 31, 1988 at 6:30 p.m. Programs are expensive.
  1. Revaluation of town.
  2. Tax receipts.
  3. General Ledger. Town authorized \$18,000; included maintenance contract, training. Contel Computer, compatible to IBM.
- 3) Letter was received from S. DiBiasco offering land for Salt and Sand Storage for \$1,500 for two years. Warren feels that we should use land to be purchased for Transfer Sta. to include the storage for it. MOTION MADE TO TABLE MATTER. VOTE 3-0.
- 4) Insurance - Fire Station - Bonds - Gym - W. C. - T. Hall - Odd Fellows Hall \$8,490. Does not include liability for Selectmen.
- 5) Transfer Station. Cornish Selectmen and Parsonsfield to meet at Pike Hall April 5, 1988 (Tues) at 3 p.m. and walk the two sites under consideration. Chalsco and land in Parsonsfield by covered bridge. Ronnie - no site as yet. The 5 towns met to dissolve Interlocal Dump Agreement. Cornish and Parsonsfield will go together and the other 3 towns will go with the South Hiram site.
- 6) Last year the Sacopee Valley High School asked to use Pike Hall for plays., and are using it again this year. They want to do something with the lighting - a switch on spot lights and a spot light. Lloyd did this for \$130. Also want spotlights in balcony. Lloyd can do this for \$700. MOTION MADE: THAT LLOYD INSTALL THE LINE, IF CONCEALED. SECONDED. 3-0.
- 7) Brent Nelson would like to purchase U3-Lot 76 (land by Mill Pond) 2.1 acres. Cannot be developed, as it is too close to Mill Pond. Three Selectmen opposed to selling. MOTION MADE THAT WE DO NOT PLACE U3-LOT 76 out to bid. SECONDED. VOTE 3-0.
- 8) Merc to be contacted and asked to send copy of contract with Town.
- 9) Tom to contact D.O.T. div. 6 at Scarborough and ask for signs to be posted on Spur Rd.
- 10) Tom would like to know more about Limington's door to door rubbish pick-up. He will call Limington selectmen.
- 11) Sand in streets and on sidewalks. State does not sweep any more. Clean-up day has been suggested. Tom to call Leona and to check with D. Whitney re use of his truck & driver. Ad in Shopping Guide - Sat. April 16th at 9 a.m. Volunteers need to help clean-up Thompson Park - bring shovels, rakes, hoes, wheelbarrows.
- 12) Youth Job Corps will mow, rake and whatever at the Park and Pike Hall, paint clean, etc.
- 13) D. Birchfield said two people have told him that the area on Route 25 in question of rezoning had already be rezoned at a T. Meeting in October 1977. (Don White and S. DiBiasco).
- 14) Albert May - Pease property, Lot 1 Pease sub-division.
- 15) Restrictions for sub-division behind I.G.A. Norris sub-division.

16) David meet with representative of Saturley's relative to "junk yard", oil tanks stored, trailers, crane etd. He is going to write and tell them to clean it up and ask them what they plan to do. Joe Traunig and Haines Gibson have both complained. Warren read Junkyard Law.
