MINUTES OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING - March 9, 1987

PRESENT: WARREN NEAL, JOHN SEELYE, BONITA OUELLETTE, SELECTPEOPLE

Items discussed:

- 1) Meeting with Water Company: Present, P. Kilburn; A. Shiland; R. Robb; G. Holstein; Wilfred Taylor. Trustees presented letter from P. Frinsco re Purchase and Sale Agreement with Howard Saturley, subject to financing. Mr. Frinsco submitted Artlceto be in Special Town Meeting March 24th asking the Town for interim financing of the Water Company until funds available through Maine Bond Bank., in the amount of \$230,000.00. There is a parcel of land not included in the sale. If the PUC agrees, there is no problem. The land bordering on Route 25 is of no value to the Water Co. Howard never committed that piece of property to be for sale. They have Accountants Report - Financial Statement and Equipment and Real Estate Inventory. Jim Smith feels that the PUC will want the land to go with the property for ground water reasons. Water Company Trustees need to advertise for a Director, given the go ahead on putting ad in Shopping Guide. The closing will take place March 31st, as it is the end of a quarter.
- 2) Jim Smith said he would be Plumbing Inspector, Building and Electrical Inspector and also CODE for 60 days.
- 3) Letter from Florence T. Weeks re plowing, feels she should be plowed better for the bus to turn around in her driveway. MOTION made and seconded that a copy of her letter be forwarded to Sanborn and let him deal with it.
- 4) Paul Gordsky re road that runs between his house to Trafton St., He has the records beginning in 1927. and wants something from the Town to be recorded at Alfred. Warren will contact Me Municipal re legality.
- 5) Planning Board is now going to meet on the 1st Tuesday of each month. It was recommended that the Planning Board information be downstairs. VOTE.
- 6) Locks - too many keys floating around. Need to have the locks changed.
- 7) Letter received from York County Commissioners denying abatement of John Seelye's taxes.
- 8) More stricter rules should be made for use of the Hall. Contract to be written by Selectmen. for the general public to abide by.
- 9) Town Reports done. Delivered in the village.
- 10) Planning Board Appointments: Members are unhappy. Four people with no experience, Warren sees no problem with what has been done.
