

**Selectmen's Meeting**  
**May 24, 2006**

Vinal Pendexter, John Palmer and Peggi Aspinall were present.

An invitation to Southern Maine Regional Planning's Annual Meeting was discussed by the selectmen with no one available to attend.

A letter from the Maine Historic Preservation Commission was received which states that Pike Memorial Hall is eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places. All nominations, before being sent to Washington for final approval, must first be presented to their Commission for preliminary clearance at one of their quarterly meetings. Vinal will discuss the matter with Norm MacIntyre, Chairman of the ADA Committee.

Motion made to go into Executive Session. Seconded by all. Motion to resume regular selectmen meeting made. Seconded by all.

The old Robinson Mfg property bought by the Humphrey brothers is bounded by the Sand/Salt facility. They have requested that the selectmen work with them to straighten out the boundary lines. Vinal has reviewed both deeds and found they both say basically the same thing but no measurements are given. The original plans of the Sand/Salt building were reviewed, and the distance was walked off by Vinal. The selectmen discussed the option of a survey, but expect it would be very costly. It was recommended that both Parties meet at the property and put a marker in the ground at the agreed upon location. It was also agreed to draft an agreement to be signed by all involved. Agreement to state that as far as the Town is concerned, without knowing anymore than we do right now, we agree that this is where the property line is. In the event that a survey is done and a more accurate location of the line was discovered in the survey that the boundary would revert to the survey lines. A motion was made to meet with the Humphreys and establish a point to drive a stake for the conditional property line that upon a survey's findings will revert to the location findings. Seconded and approved by all.

John Palmer asked for an update on the display case and plaque for the Boston Post Cane. Diane has compiled a list of recent past recipients but doesn't have dates. The list will be ready for the selectmen to contribute their input at the meeting on June 21<sup>st</sup>. Vinal says that the cabinet still remains to be constructed by Jeff Colby.

Diane presented a supplemental for tree growth withdrawal (Nicholas Perry) for the selectmen's signature. Two pole permits for Pumpkinville Road were also signed.

The list of new Personal Property accounts to be accepted for payment by the selectmen was reviewed. A motion was made to accept the new personal property accounts from Vision for payment. Seconded and approved by all.

Angel Eastman requested use of tables and chairs for a graduation party on June 17<sup>th</sup>. She had used the tables and chairs last year for a wedding. The selectmen agreed to let her use the tables and chairs.




