

BOARD OF SELECTMEN MEETING
TOWN OF CORNISH

MAY ~~X~~⁴ 1992

Meeting called to order by Chairman Vinal Pendexter at 7:15 p.m.
James and Judith LaPak present.

1. Application for Kapal Inc. (James and Judith LaPak) dba Cornish Inn for the renewal of malt, spirituous, vinous license signed in accordance with new state guidelines.
2. Received notification that York County tax is \$17,839.62 which is \$2,100 more than last year.
3. Issuing building permits for people who have not paid taxes: when these people continue to build it creates more liability to the Town. Donald Jack would like it checked with Maine Municipal Association to see if permits can be legally denied. Vinal Pendexter will call Maine Municipal Association.
4. Mr. Walsh and Mr. Palmer (in Lou Swasey's old house) are checking into MERC and Jordan contracts. They are upset because Jordan's crew did not pick up four bags of leaves. Charlene Humphrey called Jordan's and MERC doesn't accept leaves due to possibility of sand in bags. Geneva said for them to put out one or two bags each week and they would pick up or they could bring all four bags to Jordan and throw onto a truck. Jordan did pick up bags at a later date.

Mr. Palmer also asked if Fiddle Lane could be made one way from High Road down and wanted to know the procedures to do this. Asked also if the Town could consider selling the Lane to them and possibly Jay Traunig.

Carlton Candage felt that the Town has no right to sell a public way and made motion not to sell Town road to private people. The Selectmen felt it would take a vote of the Town to change the road to one way. Mr. Palmer and Mr. Walsh could submit an article for next spring's Town Meeting or they could call a special meeting. The Selectmen further discussed that the Town can't sell a road. The laws to close a road are very involved. Vinal Pendexter will write a letter to explain. Voted unanimously.

5. Introduced correspondence from October 29, 1991 from the Maine Waste Management Agency on proposed rule for "Municipal Solid Waste Reporting and Measurement of Recycling Progress" with the accompanying Annual

Reporting Form in case of enactment. Selectmen asserted that it is time to start educating, but still there is an undetermined market. Regional Waste has recycling. MERC has no consideration for recycling. Money is available for recycling program for towns making the effort. Selectmen will invite Rick Goss to the next meeting.

6. Vinal Pendexter filled out the Municipal Fiscal Information Survey from Maine Municipal Association, lacking only the overlay amount for last year. Carlton Candage checked to find that is is \$15,187.

7. Tree Growth forms for 1991 were filed late; therefore we are getting no money back. Carlton Candage will ask Warren where and when it was filed last year.

8. Vinal Pendexter will call the Department of Economic and Community Development to see what money is available to get help with rewriting zoning ordinances to compliment the Comprehensive Plan. There is money available as early as July 1.

9. Secretary instructed to post the letter from Maine State Police concerning concealed weapon permits and our agreement with them to issue these permits. They would like the Town to provide them with a print out of all permits issued by the Town. Vinal Pendexter will go through the book and write a report for them.

10. Virginia Eldridge would like to hold a dance at Pike Hall soon and if successful it would be a regular event. She also asked if it were possible to allow drinking on the premises. Carlton Candage felt we should not allow dances because there is no success records, instead there is damage that has not been cleared up. The Board felt there are liability problems if drinking is allowed or the party would need proof of insurance. Donald Jack felt that other dances by nonprofit groups have been OK and under control with no problems. More information is needed. Vinal Pendexter will look into the matter.

11. Informational: 1992 Job Creation Program. Grants available for construction projects, must create new jobs in summer of 1992.

12. Selectmen accepted Kathryn Albert's letter of resignation.

13. Vinal Pendexter will call Dianne Parkinson about the Memorial Day Parade status.

14. Carlton Candage saw an ad by Maine Municipal Association re insurance costs. Article 20 appropriated \$10,475 for insurance. Carlton Candage will further check it out and get back at the next meeting.


15. Selectmen will work one night this week with Warren Neal on updating assessing on computer.


16. Motion to adjourn. Voted unanimously.
