
A letter was received from Heli modified with the price of the pole replacement for the business park. Vinal will stop and talk to them.

Peggi asked if the selectmen had any say in the Planning Board's decisions. She was questioning why a citizen had to send out certified letters to all abutters when she was opening a home business. Vinal said that the selectmen could, and would ask the planning board about the situation.

Peggi also wanted to know about using the fairground for a new ballpark. Vinal said that the cemetery owned 8 ½ acres off the Pavilion Rd. that could be used as the cemetery won't need the land for at least 35 – 40 years.

Jack Driscoll and Myra Guild came in to discuss Habitat for Humanity. They were wondering if the town owned any land that could be used for a Humanity house. Vinal didn't think that the town owned any land that would fit their qualifications. They discussed putting an ad in the Shopping Guide asking if anyone would donate land for this purpose.
