

MINUTES OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING JUNE 19, 1989

- 1) John Davis called 6-9-89 about the Curb to Curb pickup. He stated he had put his rubbish out and it was not picked up. Warren talked with David and he said it was not at the end of driveway- was picked up and is now all straightened out.
- 2) Lloyd Sargent repaired light in hall and in the Park, but Park light is out again, Tom to talk with him.
- 3) Hessian Hill St. Sign: Bill HOxie is supposed to order new signs.
- 4) David from Northern Data will be in the office tomorrow 6-20-89.
- 5) Lot 29A U4 that belongs to Mr. Wisehart. There have been several complaints about the mess down there. Bruce Smith has been notified.
- 6) CMP letter sent authorizing a light on Pole #7, Circle Drive. No contact has been made by CMP in regard to the changing of the street lights. When, where will the rates go into effect??
- 7) Welcome to Cornish sign is moved.
- 8) Fence at Skivers if complete
- 9) Stanley Clark: Re Fire Hall. No closing as yet - now June 28th.
- 10) Lloyd Sargent was authorized to put in wiring for Drama Club. MOTION MADE AND SECONDED TO INSTALL THIS WIRING AT LLOYD'S CONVENIENCE. VOTE 3-0
- 11) Letter sent to Dick Steeves re wording of Warrant for Special Town Meeting about Pumpkinville.
- 12) Millard Solomon: Would like signs "Children Playing" placed on Route 160. Letter written in July of 1987. Policy still stands and is in effect. MOTION MADE AND SECONDED TO WRITE MR. SOLOMON AND TELL HIM THAT THE POLICY IS STILL IN EFFECT. VOTE 3-0
- 13) Date of Special Town Meeting: 1. Change of zoning of Fire Hall. 2. Pumpkinville. 3. Sign Ordinance. 4. Swapping money from Sidewalk account to Funds for street sweeping. July 26, 1989.
- 14) Sweeping Sand - have they been done? If so, amount should be voted from Surplus to Roads.
- 15) Sawyer Mountain project: Several letters have been received. Mr. Silkman; Gov. McKernon; Senator Titcomb. Matter tabled until copy of legislation is received.
- 16) Place to dump brush: Jerry Watson will take "BRUSH" no bedsprings or mattresses. In regard to stump dump: it will be a year before Parsonsfield has title to the property they plan to use as a Stumpdump. Parsonsfield is now using a pit owned by Dwight Mills. Cornish will use Jerry Watson's as much as possible. Contractors to take care of their own.

17) Septic Sludge: Rich Sanborn did not get back to Ronnie as yet. Tom spoke with Liz Dudley. Same problem as we have. - she spoke with DEP and they told her to go on doing what they are doing. Patten sub-division cannot be approved until Cornish has an approved site. Warren to call DEP.

18) Norman Watson: Tom walked with Bob Bowker and Norman and went over the ground. Septic Tank a lot less in size than Norman had imagined. Pipe would follow road. Bob B. is going to check and see what easements are proper. Norman would like to sell parcel for \$175,000. Bob B. talked with DEP and they might approve a lease of 99 years - could do it for 25 years. Tom will check with SRCC to see what M. Roy has to say. Bill Brown of DEP states that easements are usually granted with no problems.

19) Rodney Stacey Development: Lots 23 & 24. Town of Limington has put tax liens on the property - again.

20) Tax Lien Matter: Some have paid. Beverly Day will pay. If some is paid, will the Town forestall the lien process????
Joyce Berry called and wanted to talk to Warren, to date ^{Joyce} has not returned the call.

21) School allocation up \$2,000.

22) Assessing: Tom and Warren to go on Tuesday.

23) Warren will be away - G.A. matters referred to R. Othuse.
