MINUTES OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING - July 14, 1986

Present: Diane & James Parkinson; Barry Aruba; Stephen DiBiasco; Philip Kilburn; Andrew Shiland; Warren Neal; John Seelye; Dr. DiBiasco.

1) Asked Jim how things were getting along - installing windows, chimney repaired, etc. enclose back end of building, has permission to start on front of building, all this done in accordance with permission to repair fire damage. Group wanted to know when work will cease. Also which fire? Jim replied, 2nd fire did no damage, and that work should cease within a week. They asked for some kind of a timetable, stating that it has been five weeks. Jim says three working days. Warren stated that Craig said time limit should be set between Selectmen and Planning Board. The group was looking for some commitment from Selectmen on date of completion. Letter sent Jim on June 30th regarding restrictions. Site improvement not Building Construction, and he cannot change building during this time, but can work on screening by shrubbery, etc. Discussion further on providing a large trash container, illegal building blocks as well as refrigerators that should be removed (Jim states he will put them inside).

2) Beverly & Ezmund Day: Need Attorney to pursue this. Nothing done. Maine Municipal states we have to send another letter re "Junk Yard" If matter goes to Court, no legal entanglement.

3) Water District: Philip Kilburn re 1985 PUC report. and 2 quarters in 1986. Howard Saturley maintains that he has not received the Contract, he still wants to sell the Water Co. Paul Frinsco sent letter plus copy of contract. Attorney Frinsco says the only things that are holding this up are the (1) Contract and (2) 1985 PUC Financial Report. Howard says he will give them to us. Bud Runyon is Howard's lawyer.

4) Dump: Should we push for a meeting with the other towns. Doc says we should have a five town meeting, to talk about the problem of the raise in cost of dumping. Hiram agreed not to pay it. Jim Seelye to replace Don Jack on this committee.

5) Taxes: Transfers done. Taxes anticipated out 8/8/86.

6) Towns have gone on Computers. Bob Reny on Maine Municipal. Charlene, Joan and Warren can go see it. Lots of programs available.

7) DANNY Day: To remove two trees, one in front of Burleigh Loveitts, and one in front of Don Jack's. Cost of \$300.

8) Still a bad smell at Norman's
