MINUTES OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING - July 24, 1989

1) Bruce Smith here regarding Mr. Markell. Mr. Markell here re letter written by B. Smith in regard to Parking situation. He feels he is in the right with two areas "stoned" off on his front lawn and can't find out why or in what way he is in violation. There is a question if his business is a home business. Wants copies of all Performance Standards and Ordinances as adopted by Town. Marilyn has given this all to him and so has Charlene, but he says he does not have them all. He will be in on Wednesday to pick up yet another set. He is in violation of section 7.18, criteria for parking lot and 7.826. He will be at the next Selectmen's meeting, August 7th for further discussion.

2) Park: Robert Parker and Susan Coolidge here regarding noise etc. at Park. They feel the noise - threat of physical fear for the children and animals cause enough to be alarmed. E. Manning, C. Ransom, J. Lapak, Howard and Edna Carr - L. Chasse - S. Coolidge - R. Gilmor - R. Parking among those that attended a meeting at the Cornish Inn to try to resolve the situation. The Sheriff's Dept. and State Police are called, but due to the distance, are sometimes late in arriving. All this is effecting the business' downtown. They would like a curfew 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. in the park. Go slow Children signs. A meeting with sheriff and state police and residents within a couple of weeks. No parking ban 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Extra sheriff in this area. Constable for the five town area. Summer constable. Call parents of children involved. Turn off big. light.

Warren will check into the Town passing an Ordinance. The liability of a curfew. He will also call State Police tell them of the concerns and discuss it with them. On August 7th at 9 p.m., someone representing the group will be here.
