

## **Selectmen's Meeting July 5, 2006**

Vinal Pendexter and John Palmer were present. Peggi Aspinall was on vacation.

Joleen of Town Square Map gave a presentation of their services to provide a pictorial of the town and surrounding area. Pictorials (maps) will be distributed to local residents through the Shopping Guide in a mass mailing of 4,000 inserts. Town office will include three historical sites; a medium size building and two other buildings of our choice for \$240. Vinal wants the town hall, Odd Fellows Hall, cemetery, library, churches, Thompson Park, fairgrounds, and fire station for \$240. A motion was made to sign on for \$240 for the 5-year program. Seconded and approved.

Nancy Perkins and Ken Hall met with the selectmen to get some clarity regarding the scope of the comprehensive plan project. Vinal explained that the revision of the comprehensive plan was initiated by the desire to have a growth ordinance. The revision was not initiated by a state mandate or the selectmen. There is no time frame established to complete the revision work. The selectmen explained that a growth ordinance must align with the comprehensive plan. It was suggested that the selectmen meet with the committee to reiterate the expectation for the revision of the comprehensive plan to bring the committee back in line with the original purpose of the revision.

Vinal informed the selectmen that the code enforcement officer has sent a letter to Roland Scott regarding clean up of his property.

A resident of Pumpkinville sent a letter to the selectmen requesting the town install sidewalks to the Call's shopping plaza and access to Rite Aid as well.

Janet White is running for Vice President of Maine Municipal Association and asking for the selectmen's vote.

Motion made to table the discussion of the dog ordinance until all selectmen are present and to see if it's consistent with the comprehensive plan. Seconded and approved.

Vinal revisited the trash issue on Pendexter Road. At issue is "Why should people from Parsonsfield go onto private land and haul the trash out on the road side then it becomes the responsibility of the Town to pay to haul it out?" As a property owner it is the owner's responsibility to take care of your own property. No conclusion was reached. Selectmen will address at next meeting when all are present.

John Palmer expressed his displeasure with the way personal property letters went out. The letters were mail out with a bottom line figure but no detail for the figures. Hearings for personal property will be held next Monday and Tuesday.

Minutes from prior meeting were reviewed and approved along with the warrants for payroll and accounts payable.




Diane Harrington presented a progress report from Paul Mc Kenney of Vision Appraisal for the selectmen to review.
