

MINUTES OF SELECTMEN S MEETING - August 17, 1967

Present: W. Neal; R. Othuse; B. Ouellette; D. Birchfield; Jim Bowen

1) Hearing on liquor license for Stone Ridge Rest. Noone opposed. License signed by Selectmen.

2) Block Grant was received \$8,857.75 from school funds - to be used against the taxes.

3) Taxes: Motion: made and seconded that all property taxes (land and real estate) values be increased by 20%. Vote. Certified ration is .80.

Motion made and seconded that the certified ration be .80. VOTE.

4) Gordon Hall: Date in Warrant wrong, but Gordon Hall has sold Eva Lord property.

5) Appeals Board sworn in. Three members came. Don White and Bernie Mason were absent. Danny Day elected Chairman and Connie Forbes, Secretary. Appeal Bool's here from Maine Municipal.

6) Day matter: They have cleaned up a lot. Court date was August 17th. Bonnie will get in touch with Rich Redigan.

7) Kelley Meggison is requesting a renewal of a gun permit, he is in the military. MOTION made and seconded to renew Kelley Meggison's gun permit. 2 - 1 (Bonnie abstained)

8) Dump: Have looked at four sites. a. Delbert Gilpatrick will lease 3-4 acres at \$1,200 per town for 6 yrs. b. North Parsonsfield, S. D. Warren will lease for 99 years at \$1. per year. Needs to have gravel hauled in, but shouldn't cost too much to haul it in. c. Cornish - 56 acres on Route 5 (north). Committee will meet again Wednesday with Delbert Gilpatrick.

9) Letter received from Steve Farrar in regard to Sewer problem. 1. Do Outlying systems 2. Center of Town, are the two avenues that can be followed. Town would probably get more money if they do outlying sewers. MOTION: made and seconded that the outlying areas be done first. All selectmen agree. VOTE. Contact Steve Farrar to see how to implement this. Need someone to come in and design these systems. Contact Jack Murphy, West Baldwin, and see if he can do this. Soil Tests - cost - notify people and see if they are willing to put up 10% of cost. If there is any money left, we can start the cluster process for the center of town.

10) Town meeting cancelled.

11) Dump: Baldwin and Cornish are willing to go alone. David Jordan seems a little interested, wants to cut back to a couple of towns. Is the Board closer to a decision? Ronnie says no, it depends on what happens at the meeting Wednesday night. Ronnie would like to stay with the five-town project. Warran would like to go on our own, and have house to house pick-up.

12) Taxes done through "T". All taxes increased 20%. All property assessed - change value on cards.

13) Meeting adjourned.
