

SELECTMEN'S MEETING AUGUST 22, 2001

The minutes from the last meeting were signed. The accounts payable and the payroll warrants were signed.

Concerns about Rob Millard's weekly pay were discussed. Carlton will talk to Rob about it.

There was a discussion about Nancy Clark's plumbing problems that have been going on since they started working on the road. Vinal thinks she should get in touch with the Cornish Sewer District. She also has concerns about her tax bill. The DOT claimed 375 sq. ft of road frontage. Carlton will call her.

A letter was received from George Carroll. His Open Space Land was not acknowledged on his tax bill. His tax bill will be abated and new tax bills will be sent out to him.

Two quick-claim deeds were signed for Howard Saterly.

The selectmen received three letters from the Cornish Association of Business. The first letter expressed concerns about the crosswalks that the DOT originally agreed to put in. The second letter was about the trucks going through town and using their jake brakes. There is just too much noise. The third letter was about getting new Christmas lights for Thompson Park, and making the town look more welcoming. Carlton made a motion to support their efforts. The letter concerning the DOT will be copied and Carlton will deliver them to Jim Ferguson.

Dennis Mowry submitted a letter about this year's town audit. He will be hired for the audit.

There was a discussion on the raise that Carol had asked for. They don't know if the problems with the registrations have been cleared up so they will put that under old business until they receive more information.
