

SELECTMEN'S MEETING
August 6, 2003

Peggi signed accounts payable and payroll checks for Carol.

The Maine Revenue 2003 valuation return forms were signed.

Vinal explained that he had written the letter to the state requesting that the speed limit in town be reduced.

The minutes from the last meeting were signed. The accounts payable and the payroll warrants were signed.

Peggi brought up a discussion about whether the people that have to notify abutters about intentions could use a certificate of mailing that cost \$.90 instead of certified mail that costs over \$4.00. Mr. Sherman will be asked about this.

A letter was received from Heli Modified. They were asking if the amount paid to the cable co. could be subtracted from the rent payment. Peggi made a motion that the rent would be adjusted. Vinal seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

John Cleveland came in to go over the MMA Bond Bank financial application for the new Fire Station. He explained that he had gotten his information from the audit reports. He also explained that there would have to be a Special Town Meeting. A town vote is needed to accept the estimated costs, terms, and interest rates and it has to be held before Sept. 11, 2003. There will be a meeting to go over the estimates on Thursday, August 14th.






