

MINUTES OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING - September 14, 1987

- 1) Girl Scouts would like to use Town Hall Wednesdays from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m. Motion made and seconded to allow the Girl Scouts to use the Town Hall. VOTE.
- 2) Vicky Lloyd Dance Studio would like to use the Town Hall two days per week, September - May 1988 at \$30 per day. There are a lot of local children who take lessons here. Motion made and seconded that Vicky Lloyd be allow to use the Town Hall two days per week at \$30 per day. VOTE.
- 3) Gun Permit: Andrew Mattruo, (future grand-son-in-law of Robert Pike) Motion made and seconded that the Gun Permit be granted.
- 4) Water District would like to use the former kitchen downstairs in Town Hall. This is all right - no fee.
- 5) Hoyt-Ouellette Hearing, Board of Appeals, September 29th.
- 6) Taxes done. All increased 20% on valuation of land and buildings. Rate is \$18 per thousand. Commitment papers ready to be signed. Bills are to Less. Date is set for Friday for mailing.
- 7) Tax maps have arrived. Smaller versions not received as yet - estimate 3 weeks for delivery.
- 8) Legislature passed a lw that the Declaration of Values received in Town Office are now public knowledge. These need to be filed alphabetically and by years.
- 9) Patrick O'Brien now wants a Warranty Deed for the Eva Lord property. Warren will check with Bud to see what should be done.
- 10) Lisa Manning states the sidewalk is caving in at her house. Will have Bob Sturgeon look at it and he states it is up to the Selectmen. Will contact F.R. Carroll and Bob for prices.
- 11) Debbie Sanborn purchased town-owned property on Route 5 states one line does not agree in her Deed. John Tewksbury suggested a meeting between the abutter, Plummer, and the Selectmen to set a line. Warren to call Mr. Theodore Plummer, West Buxton, ME 727-3418.
- 12) Sewer Situation: Cannot reach Kenneth Gardner. John Large can not do it. David Wurtz of Hiram. Walter Horton, No. Bridgton, Brian Howard of Sanford and Eric Jones of Limerick - all possibilities.
- 13) Transfer Station: Nothing new. They have voted to have an Engineering Study done and plans drawn up. Some feel it is too much money and Normantus is no longer interested in talking about a Transfer Station. Most of the towns want out, they feel Normantus is charging too much.
- 14) The Board of Appeals will meet 9-29. In the event that they need the advice of an attorney, they would like permission to do so. Motion made and seconded that the Board of Appeals be authorized to hire an attorney if they need one. VOTE.
