

Selectmen's Meeting September 27, 2006

Vinal Pendexter, John Palmer, and Peggi Aspinall were present for the meeting.

Accounts payable and payroll warrants reviewed and approved along with the minutes from meeting on September 13th.

Motion made to go into Executive Session to discuss ACO issue. Seconded. Motion to not take any action on the matter of the Animal Control Officer and the abused animal complaint. It all took place over in Hiram and it should be Hiram's problem. Seconded by all.

A letter was received from Maine Historic Preservation Committee in regards to nomination of this building to be put on the National Historic Preservation Register. The nomination will be considered on October 27th at the Blaine House. Motion made to proceed with having the building put on the National Historic Preservation Register.

Vinal discussed an invitation from the SAD 55 to meet to discuss TABOR with the legislature and the school board on Wednesday, Sept. 4th at 7:30 p.m. He will be attending and welcomed the selectmen to join him.

Vinal passed on the 2006 LD1 compliance survey requested by MMA to Diane Harrington for completion.

Peggi asked if there was any information on whether or not we can do any ordinances to protect against the sex offender moving into town. She was given the MMA email address and an 800 number so she can contact them directly to address the issue.

Vinal spoke with Bobby Sturgeon about putting up a stop sign at Ricker turn. He will take care of installing the sign.

An 801 for New England Tool was signed by the selectmen.

The 2006 Municipal Valuation Return done by Diane Harrington was signed.

The ADA Committee submitted an invoice from Barba Wheelock to the selectmen for approval. The selectmen requested clarification of two issues; efforts to get L. Chadwick to cover cost of Site Review by Alpha One, and the dollar amount approved for the Life Safety Code work before the invoice will be approved.

Motion made to approve SVHS theatre teacher's use of Pike Hall November 10th, 11th and 12th and waive the surcharge for heat for the performances. Seconded and approved.

Motion made to approve request from Jean Bragan to use the Fire Barn for training sessions during Oct., Nov., Dec. and Feb. Seconded and approved.





The selectmen and fire department will submit a letter in support of the grant application for the Eleven Town Group.
