

Selectmen's Meeting September 8, 2010

Vinal Pendexter and Nancy Perkins were present for meeting.

Selectmen minutes, accounts payable and payroll warrants reviewed and signed.

Diane reports prices for used recycling bullets hard to find. New bullet cost \$4,200. Motion made to ask Herrick's to return the bullet to Cornish until we decide what we are going to do with it. Seconded and approved.

The abatement of \$424.67 for John and Victoria Perry signed.

801's for Personal Property in 2009 signed: Mac-Gray (Laundromat appliances at Pumpkinville and Cornish Station), GE Capital Commercial, CN Brown (2) car wash and fuel company, GE Capital Info Tech Solutions.

A transfer received from Registry of Deeds indicated R. Provencher deeded .5 acre of land from R08-047 (K. Woodbury trailer) to abutter (Kolinowski) R08-048. Selectmen reviewed the deed and the tax map but no issue found.

Dan Sherman agreed the October Workshop 10/18 be reserved to answer residents questions regarding the Shoreland Zoning changes.

As a solution to communication issues between Planning Board and Code Enforcement, selectmen decided to designate a box for materials being dropped off or picked up. The office will email notification to them.

Motion made that selectmen meet informally with Code Enforcement Officer and set a time for a formal meeting to discuss issues that have arisen. Seconded and approved.

The Dog Ordinance scheduled to be voted on at next selectmen's meeting when Peggi will be present.

Two background checks for Concealed Weapon applications reviewed.


